FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY SHOW

he Show and subsequent Leading Ladies Sale will be held at Carlisle Livestock Market. Carlisle has been chosen as a location that is easy to reach by road, is a reasonable distance from all four member countries, and can host a show, dinner dance and sale. A market location will also eliminate any complications with regard to changing TB regulations, and allow fair and free entry to all breeders.

For this one-off event, only animals whose first point of registration is the UK Herd Book will be eligible for entry. This applies to both the Show and the Sale.

Where female entries to the classes are shown with a calf at foot, the calf must be under 300 days old on the day of the show.

All sale cattle will be inspected by the Society vet, which may result in rejection of a successful show animal. Any sale animal which fails the inspection will also be removed from the showing section.

Entry to the show will be free, unless the animal is also offered for sale.

The show schedule and entry forms will be available from March 2020, and will be sent out with the spring newsletter. These will also be available on our website, via a link on Facebook and Twitter, and by post for those who request it.

Animals will arrive at the market from 10.30am on Thursday 30th July. Sponsored refreshments will be available for all

exhibitors and staff, and a dedicated team will help you unload, locate your pens, carry your kit and organise your paperwork.

Breakfast will be sponsored for all exhibitors on show day. Breakfast tickets will be supplied based on the number of animals forward.

The official Society photographers will be in attendance on all four days, and it is expected that the whole show will be streamed live to Facebook; class winners and photographs will be posted to the Facebook page.

Judging will take place in the large Exhibition Hall, which has grandstand seating and plenty of room for appropriate decoration. There is a balcony, which will be used exclusively as a Sponsors lounge. Sponsor opportunities are available - if you would like to sponsor an aspect of the show, please contact the office.

The ring will be decorated with canvas banners, which will be printed by the office. These will detail animals of particular importance over the last 50 years – high sale value, prize winners etc – to be sponsored by the breeder concerned. They will have the logo, 50th anniversary, a picture of the animal, the achievement, name of breeder and/or purchaser, the date and contact details if required. We estimate the ring will take between 30 and 40 banners. Anyone wishing to sponsor a banner should contact the office with details of the animal in question.





It is expected that judging will commence between 11.00am and midday, to be confirmed when number of entries are known. The main classes will be followed by the young handlers classes.

- Bull, born on or after 1st April 2019
- Bull, born or between 1st January and 31st March 2019
- Bull, born in 2018
- Bull, born on or before 31st December 2017

- Under 21 on 1st January 2020
- 21-30 on 1st January 2020

All exhibitors with at least one animal forward will receive a commemorative engraved crystal tumbler. All crystal will be engraved with the 50th anniversary logo, and will be a one-off piece to keep. Rosettes and sashes will also be one-off pieces.

People's Champion – the Overall Champion will be a head-tohead competition between the male and female champion, and will be voted for by the crowd around the judging ring in a secret ballot. The winner will be announced at the evening dinner dance.



DINNER DANCE

The evening dinner dance will be held at The Shepherd's Inn, which is within walking distance of the market. The dinner dance will be a three-course meal, followed by presentations and dancing. Dress code is to be a minimum of lounge suit, and the venue will be dressed accordingly. Dancing will be to Highly Strung, a band with a varied repertoire and a great reputation. Ticket price is £45 per head. Numbers are limited to a maximum of 340; it is anticipated that the dinner will sell out quickly and you are advised to book early. 



OFFICE UPDATES & REMINDERS

SOCIETY SALES - DNA & Health Declarations. It is disappointing that members are still late in getting DNA and Herd Health Declarations to the office by the close of entry for Society sales. This holds up production of the catalogue and its publication online, which is to the detriment of those members who do submit on time. Late submission of DNA gives no leeway should the test fail, and animals will not be allowed forward without a valid verification. Details of requirements for society sales are on pages 11-12 of this newsletter. All members who sell at Society sales should ensure they are familiar with the rules and regulations.

GDPR - The law now requires that in order for us to publish details of show or sale winners on the website or in the Annual Review we must have received your GDPR form. As from this year's Annual Review, if we do not have a form on record, your victories and sale successes will not be documented. If you haven't done so already, please sign a form and send it back to the office as soon as possible. A copy of the form can be downloaded from the website. **EMAIL ADDRESSES** - A large proportion of correspondence is undertaken by e-mail – it saves time, money and is environmentally friendly. Please ensure the Society holds a valid email address for you. New addresses can be emailed to information@britishsimmental.co.uk.

PRIVATE ANIMAL TRANSFERS – Vendors - please ensure that the back of the pedigree certificate is completed before the sale, and hand the certificate to the buyer. Purchasers - please complete your part of the form and return it to the office. A new certificate will be issued in your name, and the animal will be added to your herd list.

REGISTRATION OF NEW CALVES WITH UNCERTAIN

PARENTAGE - for those members who register online, please note that calves awaiting DNA results for sire verification where there are two or more possible sires, should be registered without a sire. This will put the calf into query, and the certificate will be held until the sire is verified. It will not affect the fee you pay, as long as the calf is registered on time as usual.

SUMMARY POINTS FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING IN JULY 2019

Society Sales

- From October 2019, our Society vet, Gareth Boyes, will be looking at locomotion of animals forward for sale. Gareth will have the right to reject animals from the sale if the locomotion doesn't meet required minimum standards.
- With immediate effect, the Society will be collecting DNA from all animals forward at Society sales. A percentage of these will be processed, and the remainder stored in case they are required in future.
- The Society currently contributes towards to the cost of having bulls semen tested for Society sales - a £50 credit per bull is issued for members who have sent in certification from their vets. This will be reduced to £25 from the 1st January 2020, and will expire at the end of 2020.

DNA

 As from the 1st January 2020, first-calved heifers must be sire verified. The DNA processing cost (for females only) will be reduced to £20+VAT. The Council is currently considering the viability of fully parent verifying first-calved heifers from 2021.

Membership and registration fees

• It was decided to freeze fees for 2020 while the new policy for first-calved heifers is being introduced.

• The 2021 English National Show will be held at the Great Yorkshire Show

Carlisle sale


• Current market stability has contributed to poor sales at Carlisle. Council have decided to revert to a single sale until this improves. Date is expected to be in May, to be confirmed.

Paperless Pedigrees

 The Council discussed ways in which the society could reduce its carbon footprint. One way was to make a move away from paper, in particular pedigree certificates. It was suggested that these could be emailed to members as a PDF file to be printed if required.

Social Media Policy

• Council determined that a Social Media Policy is required to be put in place. This is with the Society's solicitors.




REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTERING BULLS TO A SOCIETY SALE

- **DNA** MUST be submitted to the office before the closing date of the sale. All bulls must be sire verified.
- Herd Health Declarations MUST be submitted to the office before the closing date of the sale.
- Health scheme MUST be a member of a CheCS approved health scheme.
- **Johnes** MUST be herd screening for Johnes, and a risk level included on the health declaration.
- **BVD** Bulls which are not part of a BVD accredited-free herd must be tested BVD negative.

- **Vaccinations** All bulls must be vaccinated for BVD, and vaccine dates documented on the Herd Health Declaration.
- **EBVs** will only be printed in the catalogue for animals that are scanned and have an authenticated weight recorded.
- Semen testing All bulls listed in the catalogue (or on the pen gates) as semen tested must have official certification. A copy must be sent to the market office with the animal's passport.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTERING HEIFERS* TO A SOCIETY SALE

*For the purposes of a Society sale, a heifer is defined as a young female who has not had a calf. Calved heifers are exempt.

- **DNA** MUST be submitted to the office before the closing date of the sale. All heifers must be sire verified.
- Herd Health Declarations MUST be submitted to the office before the closing date of the sale.
- Health scheme MUST be a member of a CheCS approved health scheme.
- **Johnes** MUST be herd screening for Johnes, and a risk level included on the health declaration.
- **BVD** Heifers which are not part of a BVD accreditedfree herd must be tested BVD negative.
- **IBR** All heifers which are not part of an IBR accredited-free herd must be isolated for a minimum of seven days, and tested IBR-negative before vaccination. A copy of the laboratory report must be attached to the Health Declaration.
- **Vaccinations** All heifers must be vaccinated for BVD, and for IBR using a marker vaccine, and vaccine dates documented on the Herd Health Declaration.
- Comprehensive IBR guidelines and sale rules are detailed on pages 10-11 of the 2018 Annual Review.
