SOUTH WESTERN SUCKLED CALF ASSOCIATION SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SALE

- 1. Calves must not be less than FIVE months or more than twelve months old at DATE OF SALE and must be polled or dehorned.
- 2. All calves must be of superior type.
- 3. All heifers must be warranted as not being in calf at the date of Sale. Should any animal not conform to this warranty, the purchaser shall be entitled on return of the heifer to a refund of the purchase price and agreed cost of transport (the Auctioneers to arbitrate), PROVIDED THE CLAIM IS MADE WITHIN SIX MONTHS of the Sale Day, and is supported by a certificate from a qualified veterinary surgeon.
- 4. All steer calves must be warranted as having been fully and effectively castrated. Should any animal not conform to this warranty, the Vendor shall pay for the castration and veterinary fees upon production of a veterinary certificate from a qualified veterinary surgeon, provided this default is notified and substantiated within 14 days of the Sale (the Auctioneers to arbitrate).
- 5. No calf will be offered for sale unless correctly entered in the catalogue.
- 6. All calves must be entered on the proper Entry Form by the closing date and the Sale is confined to members of the South West Suckle Calf Association.
- 7. Steer and heifer calves must be entered in separate lots.
- 8. No single calf to be sold except where the auctioneer considers that no other course is reasonable.
- 9. Every effort should be made to pen stock by 9.30 a.m. on the morning of the Sale. Stock not ready when lot number is called will be passed over and relegated to the end of the Sale.
- 10. All calves must be inspected by the Association's Stewards in the Sale Yard. The Auctioneers will be asked not to offer for sale any animal which does not comply with these conditions and the lot number will be removed. The decision of the Association's Stewards must be accepted as final in all cases.
- 11. A levy of ½p in the £1 will be payable to the Association and will be deducted from the payments due in respect of the calves sold.
- 12. Calves must be entered in even lots. An estimated variation in weight of 50 Kgs. is the maximum acceptable in any one lot.
- 13. The Association reserved the right to refuse entries of calves at future sales from members who fail, without good reason, to present calves entered for sale.
- 14. Whilst every effort is made by the Stewards and Committee to ensure that all animals comply with the warranties stated, the Association does not warrant the condition of any calf sold at any sale. Liability rests with the Vendor in all cases of default or warranty.

Livestock Notice to Purchasers

Viewing - Times and day/date

Health & Safety - Kivells accept no liability for any damage or injury to persons, livestock, vehicles or plant not arising out of their negligence. Any person entering the livestock market premises does so at their own risk and must comply with the requirements of any Health and Safety notices. All persons entering the livestock markets premises are hereby given notice that there are potential hazards due to the type, penning, herding, loading and unloading of livestock and vehicle movement. Caution should be exercised and children must be fully supervised at all times. Kivells reserve the right to refuse admission to any person or vehicle into the livestock market premises without giving reason. Kivells strongly advise that no persons access the sale ring, pennage or livestock passageways during the sale or whilst animals are being moved through passageways. Should any person decide to enter these aforementioned areas they do so entirely at their own risk. 

From Camelford

Follow the A39 towards Bude and take the road that is sign posted for Launceston, which brings you to join the A395, follow this road until you enter the village of Hallworthy, take the left turn, sign posted Canworthy Water and Hallworthy Market, the Stockyard is then on your right hand side.

From Bude

Follow the A39 until you reach Otterham Station, turn left at Otterham Station which is sign posted Launceston and Hallworthy, which brings you onto the B3262, follow this road until you reach the junction for the A395, turn left towards Launceston and then turn immediate left, sign posted Canworthy Water and Hallworthy Market, the Stockyard is then on your right hand side.
