CHRIS MARTINDALE ELECTED AS THE 28TH **BRITISH SIMMENTAL PRESIDENT**

hropshire-based breeder Chris Martindale has been elected as President of the British Simmental Cattle Society (BSCS) following the Society's Annual General Meeting held in Stirling at the October Bull Sales.

Having served as a Council Member since 2021, he takes over from Norman Robson, Kilbride Farm, Ballyclare who had served as President for a two year term of office. Chris Martindale, who had been the Society's Vice President and Chairman of Finance, also over the previous two years, becomes the 28th Chairman of the BSCS in its 54 year history, and the tenth from England.

Chris, together with his wife Kath, joined the BSCS in 1990. Their Forsdale Herd based at Coedfa, St Martins, Oswestry was established following the private purchase of two cows with calves at foot from the Dispersal Sale of the Boscobel Herd of Mrs EP Yates, Codsall Wood, Wolverhampton. Simmental was the chosen breed as the Martindales wanted cows that were easy calving and easy managed, had good docility, and great mothering ability. Today the herd comprises of twelve pedigree cows and fits well with Chris who is the Sales Manager for Lloyd's Animal Feeds, a company he has worked for 33 years.

In recent years, the herd has gone down the polled route, again with an increasing emphasis on ease of management, and with the calves from their latest heterozygous polled stock bull, Wroxall Nescafe (P), eagerly awaited in the Spring. Keen supporters of local shows, the Forsdale Herd has met with much success showing females at Newport, Oswestry, and Denbeigh shows. Bulls are sold from the farm and to a repeat customer base. A noted pedigree judge, Chris Martindale has judged all over the country and at major shows including the Royal





Highland, Royal Welsh, and the Simmental World Congress show held within the Royal Norfolk in 2008. Most recently he judged the pre-sale show of Simmental bulls at Stirling in October 2022.

A significant momentum behind the Simmental breed has seen an uplift in commercial demand, a series of record sale averages, and increased pedigree registrations for three consecutive years. Commenting on this Chris Martindale said: "In a focussed industry, commercial producers need

"There's an increasing recognition that modern Simmental genetics gives you that and more. Easy calving, easy managed, full of milk, calving year on year, producing quality female replacements and fleshy, growthy calves. The analysis of AHDB's figures proves the performance of Simmental females, both pure and when crossed with any breed. Add in the further terminal advantages proven in age at slaughter and daily carcase gain, and it adds up to real money and performance for producers. "

A further focus of the next two years will be preparing for the 25th World Simmental Congress with it recently being announced that

this will be hosted by the British Simmental Cattle Society in the United Kingdom in 2026 (see below). In a further comment, Chris Martindale went on to say:

"I am extremely honoured to have been elected as President of one of the UK's leading beef breed societies. As a Society we'll continue to work hard and take dead aim at promoting the Simmental's abilities, to grow the breed across the UK markets. We're excited to have been awarded the World Congress in 2026 (see below), and it will provide a terrific platform for us to further showcase the Simmental breed."

BRITISH SIMMENTAL TO HOST 2026 WORLD SIMMENTAL CONGRESS!



he British Simmental Cattle Society will welcome the 'Simmental world' when it hosts the breed's World Congress in 2026! Britain was confirmed as the host following the General Assembly of the World Simmental Fleckvieh Federation held in Calgary, Canada, at this year's Congress.

Planning for the 2026 event is already underway with the Congress likely to be held over eight days in June, and which will see delegates have a heavyweight mix of open days at foremost pedigree and commercial herds; a day at the Royal Highland Show; a pedigree sale; cultural visits to landmarks and city attractions; knowledge exchange and technical presentations; and all the while taking in some of the beautiful geographies and breathtaking scenery that the UK offers. There'll be plenty of fun, some special evening dinners and socialising, and with a visit to a distillery a delegate request from the countries in attendance in Canada!

First and central, the Congress is about the cattle and it presents a unique opportunity for British Simmental to promote the qualities of the breed to a world and domestic audience. In the early stages of planning, and being pieced together, the Congress will visit geographies including the North East of Scotland, Edinburgh and the Lothians (taking in the Royal Highland), the Red Rose county of Lancashire, and with a hop over the water to Northern Ireland.

Established in Zagreb, Croatia in 1974, the World Simmental Fleckvieh Federation today has some 26 member countries and representative of all five continents. Every two years a World Congress is held in a nominated country, and with the 2026 event also being the WSFF's Silver Jubilee 25th staging.

From establishing, the aims of the WSFF have been to promote the Simmental breed through co-operation between member countries; the exchange of technical information; the comparability and harmony of pedigrees and herd books: and through the Congress, the opportunity to see Simmental cattle in their host countries and how they fit into the geography, beef system, and meet market demands.

Commenting, new BSCS President Chris Martindale said: "It's an honour for the Society to have been awarded the 25th Simmental World Congress, and what a platform it presents for us to showcase the best of British modern Simmental genetics. The days will be open and inclusive to delegates, members, commercial producers, and anyone with an interest in seeing the quality, versatility, and performance that this breed has to offer. There's work ahead but it promises to be a fantastic week."

REVISION OF SOCIETY RULES

lease note that a fully revised and updated set of Society rules has been uploaded onto the Society website and can be found at www.britishsimmental.co.uk and under 'The Society' dropdown. All new and any amended rules from the previous revision onwards, and notified to members, have been included. There are also several updates and new inclusions in what is a comprehensive revision by the Society's Council. At all times Council has tried to keep in line with the EU Zootechnics/ Directives and guidance from DEFRA.

IMPORTANT: DNA testing of animals at Simmental Society Sales

ntroduced on 1st May 2023, all animals including calves which are sold at sales held under the auspices of the Society British Simmental Society (entered into collective, draft, production, reduction and dispersal sales) which are registered as polled, must be DNA tested to confirm their polled status. This test can be ordered at the same time as the parentage verification or if your animal has already been DNA tested, it can be done retrospectively. The additional cost of the polled test is £6.60 including VAT.

Introduced from 1st January 2024, all animals including calves which are sold at sales held under the auspices of the Society British Simmental Society, must be DNA tested and sire verified. This includes all Collective Society sales (including draft animals), production, reduction and dispersal sales.

IMPORTANT: Society Sale Inspections

s per previously notified, and introduced from 1st January 2024, please note that all animals which have been given a yellow mark during the inspection under rule 13.9.1, will be eligible to be shown in the pre-sale show. The Auctioneer will announce that at the point of inspection that the animal was found to be marginally overshot or undershot.

IMPORTANT: Ultrasound Scanning of Sale Bulls

s a reminder, and as per the Society rule 13.3.5, sale vendors whose animals have been officially weight-recorded by Breedplan will have the full range of EBV's and Society Index Information published in the catalogue of sale, and pen cards produced, to a criteria of five points. With respect to ultrasound scanning the noted points are:

a) Bulls for sale must be scanned and have an authenticated Breedplan weight recorded in a BLUP run prior to the production of the given sale catalogue.

b) Bulls from a recorded herd that haven't been scanned in time for the given sale catalogue will not have EBVs and Society Index Information published in the catalogue, but will be provided with a pen card if they have been weighed.

PLEASE NOTE: the acceptable scanning age range is 300 to 800 days – however, around 400 days is preferred. Beyond this bulls can be of a size which makes them very difficult to scan due to the large size of their eye muscle.

IMPORTANT HERDBOOK REMINDER: Embryo Calf Registrations

• Including reminder reference to older/aged embryos.

ust a further reminder, it is a requirement of the Society under rule 5.8 that all ET calves are fully parentage verified upon registration. This means that both the sire and dam must be DNA tested as well as the calf. However, as per previous correspondence, the Council of Management is aware that some older embryos may be stored where the parents have not been DNA tested, and where there will not be samples available for these animals. Therefore, if you have embryos stored please contact us before use at the Society office on 02476 696513 or by email at information@britishsimmental. co.uk to check if the parents are DNA tested.

The Council of Management will consider cases individually, where parentage verification cannot be performed on ET calves due to the sire or dam not being DNA tested. However, all such calves must be registered before 31st December 2025, after which no further exceptions to this rule will be considered.

IMPORTANT: Updating breeders' herd lists

n June this year herd lists were sent to all members asking that they be brought up to date, and returned to the Society by the end of August. Thank you to everyone who has returned their listing, it really is a huge help. As at the time of this Newsletter we are still awaiting a good number of outstanding updated herd lists. Could we respectfully ask that if you haven't yet done so, could you please update your herd list and return it to the office by the end of January 2025.

If you require a further herd list to be sent to you for this purpose, then please contact the office. If it's easier we'd be happy for you to send your up to date BCMS/SCOTEID/DAERA list and we can do the necessary from that. On an ongoing basis it is hugely important that we keep the herdbook accurate and up to date, and particularly at a time when we need to be ready to transition to the new BreedLogic system being implemented by ABRI. Your help with this would be greatly appreciated.

REMINDER: Myostatin testing in British Simmental

n July this year, the Society sent out a first, and informative, letter regarding Myostatin testing in British Simmental. A copy of this information note can be found and referred to on the Society's website at www.britishsimmental.co.uk and under the Technical heading.

As an immediate reminder, the Society's Council of Management put forward the following and which was applicable from July:

Myostatin testing of pedigree Simmental cattle is optional for members of the Society. Where any animals have been tested, through the Society and/or independently, all test results will be shown in the herdbook, on printed certificates, and in all sale catalogues.' Provision for these inclusions have been made with ABRI Breedplan as the IT software providers, and you may have seen some test results in the Stirling October Simmental catalogue. Costs of myostatin testing: At the time of an animal being routinely DNA'd, there is an option for you to ask for it to be myostatin tested if you would like to. This increases the costs of the standard DNA test by £5.50, and to a total of £33.00 + VAT.

NEW WELSHPOOL SALE FIXTURE ADDED TO BSCS SPRING SALES

The Society is pleased to announce the introduction of a new Simmental Sale fixture to be held at Welshpool on May 15th 2025. The sale will be held alongside the established Limousin fixture held on the same day. With the ongoing aim of growing the reach and visibility of the Simmental breed in England & Wales, the sale will look to encompass bulls, females, and an entry of Simm X Hi Health heifers. Commenting BSCS Council member for Wales, Dafydd Jones said: "There's a growing market for, and recognition of, Simmental genetics in Wales that we hope this sale will meet and develop over time.
