**T**he 2025 year is drawing to a close and just seems to have passed in a flash. In this short December newsletter I would like, on behalf of the Society's Council, staff, and personally, to wish you and your families a very Merry Christmas, and a happy, healthy, and prosperous 2026.

It's an important 'tradition' that the President's message also extends a very sincere thank you for your continued support of the Simmental breed and membership of the British Simmental Cattle Society. As I've gone round shows, sales, and events this year it has been so heartening to see the positivity within the membership, and to feel the ongoing vibe of momentum for this amazing Simmental breed. One feature for me has been the amount of young people so obviously getting involved and fully hands on at shows and sales, and we have also warmly welcomed many new members in the year. To all members, the Society's commitment remains firmly in place to work as hard as we can to continue to promote and grow the reach of the breed to pedigree and commercial producers throughout the United Kingdom.

In keeping with recent predecessors, this end of year Newsletter also gives me the further opportunity to reflect on a year of very solid performance, and littered with some spectacular sale highs. Starting at Stirling in February we saw Simmentals sell the most bulls of any breed, to



an incredible average of £9,832, an all-breeds record average at that time, and with a new UK and European breed record of 56,000 guineas for a Simmental bull! Roll on to October and the bar was lifted again with the Simmental bulls averaging £11,070, up by £3636 on the year, and the first time the breed has led the all-breed averages at Stirling with trade again driven by demand from commercial producers. Special days to be a part of and taking the breed to new heights. Through the year we have seen 20,000gns bulls sold at both Worcester and Carlisle, and in recent weeks we've seen a terrific herd sale at Welshpool reflect a breed demand in Wales.

It's a massive well done to all of the breeders involved for the quality of the stock being brought forward which is igniting the interest, and meeting the expectations, of commercial producers.

At the time of writing pedigree registrations are slightly up in the year, as is membership, and whilst acknowledging undoubted challenges ahead, it is a very positive way to finish the Simmental year and look forward to 2026 with more than a little optimism.

Within this Newsletter, you will see once again a packed schedule of Simmental sales, shows, and specialist events around the United Kingdom lined up for next year. These are exciting breed times and I'd encourage everyone to get involved, support the calendar of events where you can, and as the sum of our parts let's collectively keep pushing and promoting British Simmental!

## 30,000GNS GARMOUTH ROBERT TOPS THE TRADE AS RECORD-BREAKING AVERAGE £11,070 AT STIRLING!

- 61 Bulls average £11,070, up by £3636 on the year
- Simmental leads all-breed averages
- Average a new all-centre Simmental breed record
- 28 bulls (46%) make 10,000gns or more
- 86% clearance of bulls

**S**tirling was the place to be as the Simmental breed enjoyed a record-breaking sale at United Auctions on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> October, with a top price of 30,000gns and a breed record average of £11,070 for 61 sold through the ring.

A mighty 28 bulls reached 10,000gns or more and which saw the average increase on the year by a massive £3,636, and for 12 more sold. In all the sale saw an 86% clearance of the bulls forward. A trade driven by pedigree and commercial buyers, the Simmental average was the highest across all breeds in the week. The sale average of £11,070 was a new Simmental breed record figure, eclipsing the £9832 figure set at Stirling in February this year.

Leading the trade at 30,000gns, was the April 2024 born Garmouth Robert from the 12-cow herd of Laura Beattie, Corskie Farm, Garmouth, Fochabers. In the pre-sale show this bull had stood as Junior Champion, and Overall Reserve under the eye of the judge Geoff Anderson of the Quarryhill herd, and herd manager of the Pitgaveny herd, Lossiemouth. Purchasing the day's top priced bull was the Backmuir herd of Reece and Andrew Simmers, Backmuir Farm, Keith.



It was a top day all round for the Green family, Corskie Farm, Garmouth. The pre-sale show saw the family double with Corskie taking the Overall, and with Garmouth lifting the Overall Reserve. Sale time saw Garmouth take the day's top price and with six Corskie bulls averaging £14,490 to a top of 20,000gns for the Champion, Corskie Rome.
